

mentioned above. He was born on April 17, 1841, living only until Aug 27, 1841. The first marriage to take place at Christ's Church was between David Gandi or Gondie and Sarah Fathers, both of Cayuga. [Likely South Cayuga Township.]

In 1886 a new organ was needed and to this effort a garden party was held at the home of Mr. Thomas Docker, on the evening of June 9<sup>th</sup> to raise funds. The Live Oak Hose Co. band performed and a platform was provided for those wishing to dance. Admission was 25 cents for adults and 15 cents for children. Fund raising was sufficiently successful to permit the purchase on July 9, 1886 of a new organ from Wm. Bell & company of Guelph. Further events were held including a "social in the aid of the Organ fund" at James Moss's home where music and appropriate amusements were featured. It was written in a local paper, " Our friends at the Port have the reputation of doing all things well, and we feel assured that all who attend will spend a very pleasant evening."
